- 2 hours of quality PE teaching for children in KS1 and KS2.
- Use of quality equipment by all children.
- Attendance at competitive events across the locality organised by WESSP staff.
- Play Leaders leading a variety of fun games and activities at playtimes and lunchtimes, enabling children to be more active.
- 120 KS1 children participated in a Tag Rugby coaching session led by a sports coach.
- 15 KS1 children attended a Rounders Festival and played against other local schools.
- 30 KS1 children played attended a Tag Rugby Festival and played against another local school.
- Took teams to the Netball, Swimming and Cross Country County Finals. We won the Y3 girls individual Cross Country Final.
