

Year 1 –

This week the children heard the story 'Fletcher and the Falling Leaves' by Julia Rawlinson. We listened to the story as a class and were able to sequence the events, along with writing sentences to describe the story. This autumnal story has fantastic links to our Geography topic of Weather and Seasons.

In Maths we have been exploring subtraction using cubes to help us. We also wrote number sentences using the subtraction and equals sign. We are really impressed with how hard the children have tried this week!

In Science, we went for a walk around the school grounds to look for signs of Autumn. We then wrote some sentences about what we had seen.

Homework

Year 2 –

In Maths this week we have been adding and subtracting and finding missing numbers in calculations e.g. $12 + \underline{\quad} = 15$

As part of our History and English work we have been learning about Dr Martin Luther King. We read lots of information about him and watched a video too. We wrote different facts about his views and his life and made our own fact file with the information.

In PSHE we have been learning about feeling grateful and how we might show gratitude to others e.g. clapping for key workers during lockdown.

In RE we learnt about the Harvest Festival and why this is an important time of year for Christians who thank God for the food and the Harvest.

Homework

Reading is homework and the children should be reading to an adult at least 4/5 times a week, and reading diaries signed and dated. Please make sure that your child is doing this as it makes a considerable difference to their progress in reading, particularly if they talk and answer questions about what they have read.
