Impact of this spending on the children (2018-2019):

- Awarded GOLD School Games Mark.
- Children were more active during curriculum lessons as they participated in more physical maths lessons.
- Introduced Table Tennis to KS2 children, through lunchtime and after school clubs. We qualified for the Essex County Finals in both the team event as well as an individual event, achieving success in all.
- Daily Mile track continued to be used by all classes at least 3 times a week.
- Six Y5 children trained as sports leaders.
- Four Y5 children attended a 'Gifted and Talented' Day at a local secondary school.
- Use of quality equipment by all children.
- Attendance at competitive events across the locality organised by WESSP staff.
- Took teams to 5 Essex County Finals - KS2 Tag Rugby, SEN Kurling, Indoor Athletics, Cross Country (10 individual and 2 teams) and Table Tennis team and individual events.
