Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about famous and significant people.

- One of Beatrix Potter's favourite hobbies was drawing. Find some different objects from around your house and have a go at drawing them. You could use pencils, colouring pencils, felt tips, crayons or even paint!
- Queen Victoria had many different crowns that she wore. How about you have a go at designing and making your own crown. You could use recyclable materials such as bottle tops and foil. Think about the shape, size and colour of your jewels.



- Print out or draw a picture of Peter Rabbit (<https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-t-19785-the-tale-of-peter-rabbit-colouring-sheets>). Can you have a go at using the technique of collage to make his blue coat? You could use materials such as blue paper/card, wrapping paper, cereal boxes etc.
- Have you got a favourite famous person that you would like to find out about? Why not do your own research online and write some facts about them to show your teachers on dojo.
- **The Queen: Then and Now-** What was life like for Queen Victoria? This video may help your child to understand https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XqPlj2_w_6M&safe=active. How is life different for the current queen? Ask your child to create a list of the similarities and differences. They might focus on appearance, family and interests. They could show this using illustrations too.
- **A Seriously Significant Somebody-** Who is important to you? What makes them so important? You could draw or paint a portrait of your significant somebody using a photograph or digital image to support you. You may wish to write an information report about this person too!
